A special Camp, organized for the younger Riders

Instructors are expected to teach about four hours of riding each day. Their aim is to help you and your horse achieve the correct standard for your next Pony Club Certificate.

The First Day will commence at 10am and if it is raining, the morning session may be unmounted, but the afternoons will definitely have riding. Make sure that you bring plenty of clothes, coats, etc and warm rugs and food for your horse. The following day's sessions will start at 9am.

*The Two Day Clinic will cost \$120 per rider. If you can only come for one of the two days, it is \$60 per day.*

*This includes all meals!*

Riders must be members of PCAV. Adult Riders may also attend, but will be required to pay an extra \$10 fee per day.

Riders and Horses can stay at the Club overnight (Monday). Floats will be parked inside the pony club grounds

The Canteen will be open and lunches, tea and breakfast are supplied. I recommend that each rider also bring some food (lollies) to share with the group.



*You will be kept busy the whole time, with riding and theory work.*

There are 14 individual yards for the horses.

There will be adult supervision at all times.

# BOOKINGS CLOSE - FRIDAY 23RD MARCH

This camp is intended to be a very busy riding clinic. We would prefer riders to camp over, as if the weather is poor, we will be concentrating more on the theory side of the course

We will start earlier in the morning on Tuesday, and riders must be prepared to ride in the rain if necessary.

Pony Club riders will not be allowed to leave their groups, or the pony Club Grounds, without parent permission.

We have quite a large club room with internal toilets. There are some couches to sleep on, but it may be better if you

bring your own air mattress or camp stretcher. There are no showers. Riders will need to bring sleeping bags, extra clothing, etc.

Pony Club Competition uniform is not required. All riders will need an approved hard hat, riding boots, arm band, etc. It is recommended that you bring a jumping vest.

Riders may bring mobile phones, but they are their personal responsibility. Don't lose them!

Parents are welcome to stay overnight. All cars and floats are to be parked inside

the Pony Club Grounds overnight, with the gates locked. All riders sleeping overnight must be aware that poor behavior will not be tolerated, and parents will be contacted.

All meals are supplied. Breakfast will include cereals and toast and Jam. Pancakes if you are good! Lunch will be sandwiches, chips, etc. Tea will include soup, sausages, salads and apple pie. Cordial supplied, but soft drinks must be paid for separately. Free tea and coffee for parents.

## INDIVIDUAL YARDS FOR YOUR HORSES

Your horse's care and safety will be looked after before your own. You will need to bring feed, water buckets and rugs for your horse.

There are small individual yards for most horses.

Just remember that as we will be riding earlier on the second morning, you may be at a disadvantage if you do not keep your horse at the club grounds. Also you may need to use your horse after the riding lessons on the Monday, for theory

lessons

Feed and rugs, etc may be stored under cover, in your floats, or in the clubhouse.

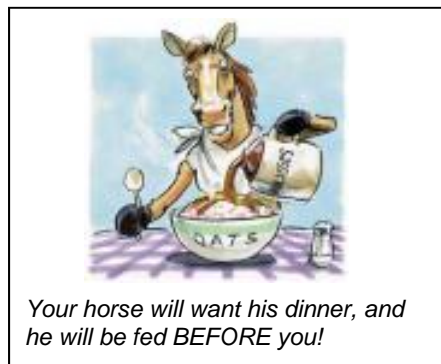
Bring hard feeds and hay and plan to have too much rather than too little, as your horse will be doing heaps of work over the two days.

Make sure that you have plenty of warm horse rugs, as the Yards are not sheltered.



*Bring at least two saddle blankets, so that you do not have to reuse wet blankets.*

*Look after your horse's back.*



*Your horse will want his dinner, and he will be fed BEFORE you!*

## PREPARE A LIST OF ITEMS

Start a list now of what you need, beginning with basics, such as the saddle, girth, and bridle. Then add your bits, like hard hat and riding boots.

Now add food for your horse, grooming gear, and for both of you - rugs/clothing suitable for cold wet weather.

Don't forget the luxuries, such as sweets (for energy), hot water bottles (joking) and horse videos.

Also prepare a check list for the week before, such as checking that your horse's shoes are not too worn or loose and that you do have suitable feed and water containers.
